Student Learning Outcomes (SLOs)

Upon successful completion of the course, the student will be able to:

- 1. Identify the role of the CNA and HHA and the state requirements for certification.
- 2. Identify principles of client safety, including environment assessment and emergency procedures.
- 3. Demonstrate skills necessary to perform nursing assistant and home health aide procedures safely and effectively, including accurate measurement of vital signs, transfer techniques, bathing/grooming principles, feeding techniques, and accurate documentation of skills.
- 4. Describe basic infection control procedures, client rights, and confidentiality.
- 6. Utilize beginning principles of therapeutic communication while providing culturally sensitive care to all clients.
- 7. Explain responsibilities to prevent, recognize, and report client abuse.
- 8. Identify and address the special needs of clients with developmental and mental disorders, HIV/AIDS, Hepatitis, TB, as well as those who require rehabilitative care, hospice care, and palliative care.
- 9. Explain nutrition concepts pertinent to the role of the home health aide, including: basic principles of diet, meal planning/serving, and food purchasing, preparation, sanitation, and storage.
