EVC CELEBRATES TESLA START GRADUATES

On Thursday, June 16, the newest cohort of 8 Tesla START students celebrated their graduation. Tesla START is a 12-week program where students develop technical expertise and earn certifications through a blended approach of in-class theory, hands-on labs, and self-paced learning. Following completion of the program, they interview at Telsa for full-time jobs. Among this cohort of 8 graduates, 100% of them will begin working for Tesla.

EVC is one of only 9 community/technical colleges in the United States with this unique Tesla partnership.

- attend a dual enrollment course
- participate in supplemental instruction and study café to develop college-going habits.
- engage in daily workshops that focus on financial literacy, academic research, mental health, and career exploration.


For the last week of the program,

EVC RECEIVES \$500,000 GRANT TO DEVELOP ONLINE INFECTIOUS DISEASE CERTIFICATION PROGRAM



Evergreen Valley College is excited to announce that we have been awarded a California Apprenticeship Initiative through the California State Chancellor's Office for \$500,000 to support the full curriculum development of the online custodian infectious disease certificate.

EVC's Custodian Apprenticeship Resources and Education (CARE) program will build off our pilot infectious disease certification program in partnership with Building Skills Partnership and will support 25 janitors and cleaners each year.

In addition, he shared how important EVC's Disabilities Support Program (DSP) and tutoring were to him. "Evergreen Valley College was so impactful for me as a student with disabilities," said Martin. "I received lots of support and was shown so much empathy and compassion. EVC empowered me to voice my opinions and advocate for myself."

Martin graduated from San José State University last year with a Bachelor's in Creative Arts. His dream job is to be a librarian. He has been gaining valuable experience as a bookseller at Barnes & Noble but recently took another step closer to living his dream as a volunteer library technician at EVC. He is beyond excited about this opportunity. "This is helping me get closer to my dream of being a librarian," said Martin.
