
Evergreen Valley College is the first official campus to collaborate with the San José Digital Inclusion Partnership to offer low-cost and potentially free internet for qualifying students and their families through the Affordable Connectivity Program (ACP).

Students with a household income of \$53,000 or less for a family of 4 can see if they are eligible to participate.




