




STUDENT ETHNICITY


Are you changing schools or hoping to transfer to a four-year university after your time at EVC? We've got you covered! We know that transferring can be daunting, and we're here to make the transition seamless and efficient.

EVC has a Transfer and Career Center whose mission is to help students achieve their career and transfer goals by providing them with the tools and guidance to be successful. Our students have transferred to many universities, including Historically Black Colleges and Universities (HBCUs) and Ivy League schools.

We also have transfer agreements with CSUs and UCs for students who want to stay in-state.

GET STARTED

Fill out a FRESH assistance application at **evc.edu/basic-needs** for on and off-campus resources like housing, food, mental health, childcare, transportation and other county services.

C.A.R.E. CLOSET

For current students, the C.A.R.E Closet was established to provide immediate basic need items, such as toiletries, diapers, laundry detergent, towels, and feminine hygiene products to EVC students

CAMPUS SHOWERS

Providing showers in our gym and toiletries.

TECHNOLOGY

BASIC NEEDS

On a limited basis, EVC offers current students loans on laptops, hot spots and help with the Emergency Broadband Benefit Program

PARENTING STUDENTS

Parenting Hubs on campus offer a lactation suite, diapers, child clothing, baby food, and a book library.

CALFRESH

CalFRESH, is a federal benefit program that helps students buy groceries. Our Basic Needs Coordinator can help students with the application.

SECOND HARVEST FOODBANK

EVC offers a free food distribution on the first and third Fridays in Parking Lot 1 from 9:30 a.m. to 11 a.m

THE F.R.E.S.H MARKET

Povides grab-and-go and other options (boxed cereal, canned goods, etc.) that may require students to prepare.

THE FARMER'S MARKET

Available on the second and fourth Thurday from 9:30 a.m. to 1 p.m. in the Central Green with an assortment of product, milk, eggs and other items.





HEALTH SERVICES

EVC Health Services provides confidential health care, including physical exams, low-cost lab testing, and prescription medications. Additional services include: pregnancy testing, birth control, HIV/ STD testing and treatment, nutrition/health education, and smoking cessation counseling. Our medical clinicians also provide referrals to specialists and community health agencies.

MENTAL HEALTH/WELLNESS

Short-term personal counseling is provided on a limited basis to students who are seeking support for their emotional needs and who are experiencing mental health related barriers that are limiting their ability to successfully pursue a college education.

EOPS / CARE

EOPS provides guidance and support to first generation students and helps them to achieve their academic, career, and personal goals. EOPS participants have access to priority registration, comprehensive academic counseling, financial aid and scholarships, book vouchers, and more.

NEXTUP / FOSTER YOUTH PROGRAMS & SERVICES

FYPS provides current and former foster youth students with holistic guidance and support to help them navigate, transition, and succeed in college. FYPS benefits include financial grant support, priority registration, dedicated academic counselor, book vouchers, school supplies every semester, scholarships, and much more.

DISABILITIES SUPPORT PROGRAM

The Disabilities Support Program (DSP) is designed to provide accommodations and services to students with documented physical, psychological, and learning disabilities to participate in all aspects of the college community.

VETERANS FREEDOM CENTER

EVC welcomes all former and current military and their dependents to utilize the services of the VFC. The Center helps with VA benefits, certification, VA medical services, as well as a dedicated counselor, priority registration and other educational benefits.

OASISS

Our mission is to provide immigrant students with the necessary tools and information to succeed in pursuing a higher education and professional career. Our bilingual staff offers academic counseling, career coaching, book vouchers, laptop loans and immigrant related services. The mentorship and community have done so much for me. For me, those are the most important resources on campus. With the support and the new connections, I accomplished a great deal with my club activities, personal growth, professional development, and future educational goals.

ASSOCIATED STUDENT GOVERNMENT

The Associated Student Government, known on campus as ASG, is responsible for promoting campus-wide activities, offering club support, encouraging your involvement at EVC and the community, and creating a friendly environment for you to meet your academic goals.

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ASG CLUBS

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Our ASG-sponsored student clubs provide a space for students with similar interests, like the Nursing, ARROW (robotics), Auto, eSports / Gaming, Biology, Art, Vietnamese, Muslim and other great clubs!

ASPIRE

The ASPIRE (Asian/Pacific Islander Resources for Excellence) Program at Evergreen Valley College is designed to increase the academic and personal success of Asian/Pacific Islander students, utilizing the commitment and skills of faculty, staff, and mentors.

ASPIRE + PLLUS

Is a student support program that helps minimize barriers in marginalized communities within the AAPI community. The program provides a number of career workshops and speakers.

ENLACE

Enlace, which began in 1983, is an academic program, is composed of a team of college staff and community mentors, and several peer student tutors. Enlace offers courses in English, reading, math, and science. In addition, Enlace helps first semester students and transfer students.

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INTERNATIONAL STUDENTS PROGRAM

Our International program not only for students looking to transfer to a four-year college, but also study in a new country (and sometimes learn a new language). Our friendly staff help you navigate the U.S. college system and provide caring support services.

UMOJA-AFFIRM

Is an academic program designed to increase African American students' retention, and transfer. However, we are more than just an academic program. Umoja-AFFIRM is a community that provides nurturing services; although specifically designed for African American students, we serve students of all ethnicities.



FREE COLLEGE CREDIT WHILE IN HIGH SCHOOL

Evergreen Valley College offers various early-college opportunities for K-12 students, allowing students to complete college courses while still enrolled in middle or high school. In addition, Dual Enrollment is open to adult education students who are enrolled in a GED or high school equivalency program at an adult school.

TYPES OF DUAL ENROLLMENT

College & Career Access Pathways (CCAP)

A student attending a high school in partnership with EVC through a CCAP Agreement and enrolls in a designated CCAP course is considered a CCAP Student. CCAP Students do not pay enrollment fees or material fees. CCAP Students can take up to 15 units per semester (4 courses).

Concurrent

Any high school student taking a class at their own accord is considered a concurrent student. Most students will fall in this category. Concurrent students do not pay enrollment fees and can take up to 11 units in Fall/Spring and 7 units in the Summer.

TRIO TALENT SEARCH is a free, federally-funded program that serves five target High Schools in San Jose, helping low-income and potential first-generation students successfully graduate from secondary school and enroll in post-secondary education.

UPWARD BOUND

Upward Bound serves: high school students from low-income families; and high school students from families in which neither parent holds a bachelor's degree. The goal of Upward Bound is to increase the rate at which participants complete secondary education and enroll in and graduate from institutions of postsecondary education.

TRIO SUMMER RESIDENTIAL PROGRAM encompasses a six-week collegegoing experience. Students engage in five weeks of college courses and one week at a university residence hall with Upward Bound program participants and staff.





CREATE AN ED PLAN

In order to be successful at EVC, we encourage students to visit our Counselors and develop an Ed Plan. Be sure to also use our Program Mappers online to help guide your academic journey.

HOW TO START

Go to the First Stop Center for assessment information and assistance in creating Self-Service and Canvas accounts. New Students must complete the online orientation before meeting with a counselor.

DOES MY CLASS COUNT?

Many of our students come to us from a previous university. We suggest you contact Admissions and submit your previous transcripts and then talk to a counselor about how you can complete your academic goals.



FEES TO ATTEND

For California residents, Evergreen Valley College costs \$46 per unit to attend. Non-residents and international students have a cost of \$423 per unit.

We don't want students to be burdened by finances, so we have developed options for them, including Payment Plans, Financial Aid and Scholarships.

FIRST 2 FREE

Students who don't qualify for the California Promise Grant but submitted FAFSA may still be eligible to get their fees waived if they are a new/first time student, plan to enroll for both semesters, are a California resident and meet other requirements.

DROP FOR NON PAYMENT

Students are responsible for paying their bills prior to the start of the term. The District has implemented a Drop for Non-Payment policy, if the students owe over \$100, are not part of an exempt group or have setup a payment plan, they will be dropped from future registered classes and a hold will be placed on their accounts.

PAYMENT PLANS

Payment plans make it easy to plan, budget and pay tuition payments on-time, interest free and without any surprises. Students can enroll in an available plan and make payments.

FINANCIAL AID

You are encouraged to apply for financial aid by completing and submitting the Free Application for Federal Student Aid (FAFSA), California Dream Act Application (CADAA) or California College Promise Grant (CCPG) application.

CALIFORNIA PROMISE PROGRAMS

The California College Promise Grant, serves more than 1 million California community college students each year. It waives tuition fees for eligible students.

SCHOLARSHIPS

Scholarships are a financial resource provided to students by the generosity of the San Jose Evergreen Foundation, local businesses, special programs, alumni, and a variety of other private donors. Scholarship funds help to assist students in paying their expenses when federal and state financial assistance is not enough. Scholarship funds are limited and usually awarded on a competitive and/or special criteria basis. **sjeccd.academicworks.com.**

BE A PART OF THE ARTS!

Athletes are afforded dedicated coaches, a fulltime athletics trainer, study hall, personalized counseling and rigorous training to compete in the Coast Conference.

ABOUT OUR TEAMS

The men's soccer team regularly appears in the national and state rankings and prides itself on recruiting in the City of San Jose.

Our women's soccer team is a regular fixture in the 3C2A playoffs. Over three years the Lady Hawks boast a 99 percent graduation rate.

We also offer women's badminton.

TRANSFER AS A STUDENT-ATHLETE

As a student-athlete at EVC, you are supported. You receive a dedicated counselor to setup an Ed Plan and make sure you are eligible to compete. Athletes must carry 12.0 units a semester.

Our athletes also transfer to four-year universities either to continue their studies or play at the next level.
