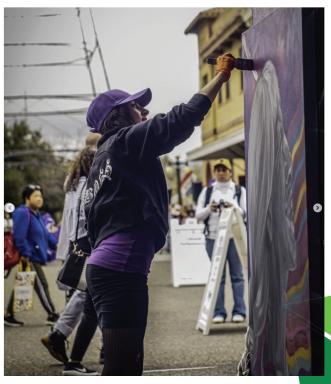


STUDENT SUCCESS

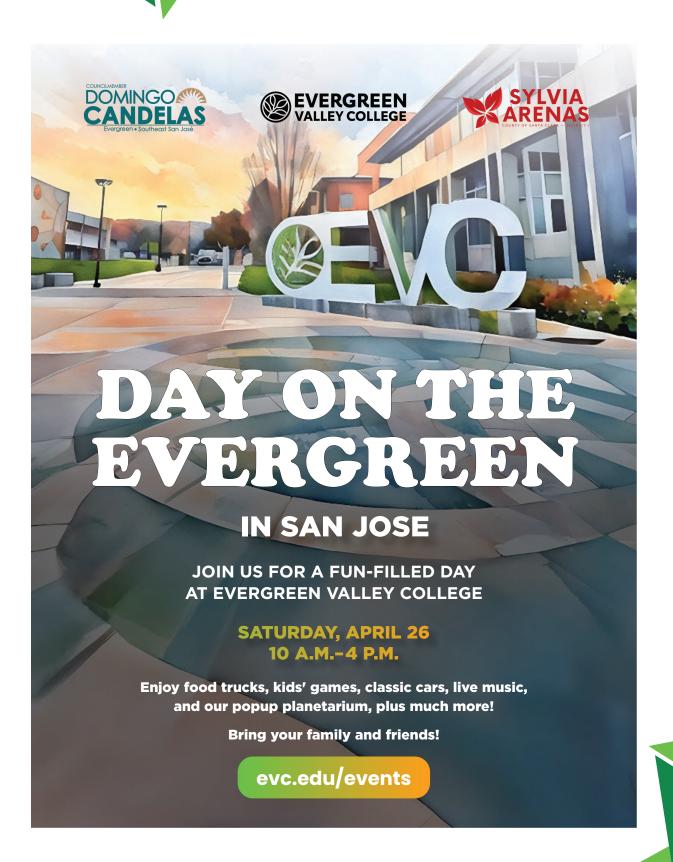


History professor Eric Narveson took an academic approach to teaching students about Fascism, its origins, and how Democracies combat it.

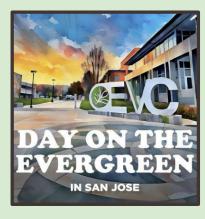
