Stewart</b></p>	<p><b>3:05-3:10p</b>  <b>AJ 019: Law Enforcement in Multicultural Communities + All DE Modalities (3 units)</b></p> <p>This course explore the complex and dynamic relationship between people and the U.S. Justice System in addressing crime, conflict, and quality-of-life.</p>
<p><b>Proposal time-----</b>  <b>Proposer:</b>  <b>C. Bevan/</b>  <b>S. Stewart</b></p>	<p><b>3:10-3:15p</b>  <b>AJ 110: Drugs and Society + All DE Modalities (3 units)</b></p> <p>This course will examine the history, evolution, classification, and physiological effects of psychoactive drugs.</p>
